Springtime in Kansas

As I sit at my computer, it is raining! The whole world out my window is being refreshed with a gentle cleansing drizzle. Every tree branch has flowers or leaves beginning to emerge. The grass is that vibrant early-spring green. The birds chirp with melodious delight. God has smiled upon all creation and declares, 'It is good!'

Easter found us outside the tomb peeking in. We lingered because we try to understand. We try to name our confusion. We know the story. We believe the tomb was empty. Christ is risen! And we rejoice and celebrate God's victory over death. But how can we hold on to the joy?
